The following information is to inform you which topics your children will be studying next year in Foundation 1 (pre reception), Foundation 2 (reception), Year 1 and Year 2.

Foundation 1(Pre-reception)

Term One

- **Ourselves, Colours and Nursery Rhymes** (including myself and my family, colours, rhymes - five little speckled frogs, five little ducks, hickory dickory dock, Incy Wincy spider and Humpty Dumpty)

Term Two

- **Gardens and Growing** (including The very hungry caterpillar, kites, The Arctic, I'm a little tea pot and the beach)

Term Three

- **Transport, Fruit and Vegetables and Keeping Healthy** (including, fruit and vegetables, houses, birds, under the sea and transport.)

Foundation 2 (Reception)

Term One

- **Ourselves and other Animals** (including myself and my family, pets, dinosaurs, wild animals and farm animals, mini beasts (butterflies, bees and insects)

Term Two

- **Traditional Stories and Rhymes** (including well known fairy tales and songs/rhymes.)
